

The Absence of Women: Zimbabwe 2018 Election

Gender Analysis of Nomination Court Results for Direct Elected Seats in the 2018 Election

This report is a gender analysis of the results of the Nomination Court process for the Zimbabwe 2018 Harmonised Election .

Nomination Court was held on the 14th of July 2018. The analysis is based on the results of the Gazetted Nominees. These results will be affected by any corrections or changes to the Lists of Candidates after the 14th of June 2018 and are not reflected in this analysis.

The Gazetting of the National Assembly candidates by Direct Election on the 22nd of June, 2018 and the candidates for Local Authorities is indicative of a political party system that persistently and systematically erodes women's right to equal representation as evidenced by the appallingly low numbers of women being fielded by political parties in this July 2018 Election.

Political parties' failure to respect the Constitutional provisions with regards to the rights of women enshrined in Sections 17, 56 and 80 amongst others, is demonstrative of political parties that cherry pick which sections of the Constitution they seek to respect and which ones they will ignore.

This is further entrenched in the public political discourse that seeks to advise women to seek the support of enactment of subsidiary legislation, to ensure that political parties, who are contesting public office governed by the values, principles and obligations set out by the Constitution respect the Constitution.

Political parties have indeed the right to organise themselves and undertake their internal processes in regards to their own internal rules and regulations, but these rules and regulations are not above the law and are subject to the Constitution as any other institution in Zimbabwe. Therefore, political parties clearly did not take the opportunity of the Nomination Court to finalise and address the Constitutional discrepancies arising from their respective selection processes that had yielded results that are constitutionally questionable.

The right to representation is not qualified by merit or social standing or any other factor. Women have a


Constitutional right to be equally represented. There is no democracy without equality.



Province with the highest number of women Independent candidate at Local Authority Level Bulawayo


Province with the lowest number of women Independent candidate at Local Authority Level












The Potential Presidents

The 2018 Election cycle has been quite notable as it is the first time that Zimbabwe has had women on the presidential ballot. A total of 23 presidential candidates are in the presidential race and four of these are women. It is noteworthy that even these women Presidential candidates' parties did not field equal numbers of women and men, either at Local Authority or National Assembly.
